



## **Pupil Inclusion Centre**

The Pupil Inclusion Centre exists to provide a staffed centre working with an identified group of students advocating a holistic approach, implementing a programme that addresses individual students need. The main purpose is in relation to attainment, improving motivation and self-esteem, increasing social skills and challenging unacceptable behaviours. Emergency support is also provided to cover crisis periods as and when needed.

The focus of clients is key stage 3, however existing work with older key stage 3 pupils will continue into key stage 4 if necessary.

Time spent in the PIC is individually negotiated as to need, but would not normally be for more than a term and no student, wherever possible, would be withdrawn from their entire curriculum.

We are here to assist all students in school and our target groups include:

- Those who have poor anger management skills
- Those who have difficulty accepting sanctions
- Those who have poor social and communication skills
- Those students who are shy or withdrawn or anxious
- Those who have attendance issues
- Those who are victims of bullying, and the bullies themselves
- Looked After Children
- Students who need special provision as a result of medical issues
- Those who are at risk of exclusion
- Crisis Intervention e.g. bereavement, family breakdown
- KS2/KS3 transfer

We work with parents and outside agencies to facilitate the best outcomes for students.
